Dear Westford residents,

Thank you to our new Veteran's Services Officer, Ryan Cobleigh, State Representative Jim Arciero, Selectman Vice Chair Andrea Peraner-Sweet, members of our public safety departments, and all attendees for a meaningful memorial service honoring all of those who lost their lives or were impacted by the tragic events of September 11th, 2001. Westford will never forget.

Wednesday, September 12th was Pumpkin Day across town. Members of the Westford Community Garden expressed their thanks to town departments by delivering pumpkins grown in the George Fletcher Pumpkin Patch. Town staff helps with registrations, finances, mowing and tilling, water infrastructure, and distribution of food at the food pantry. Thank you to the members of the Community Garden for helping us to decorate our offices with pumpkins to celebrate the coming fall!

Town Meeting is swiftly approaching. Please mark your calendars to join us in the Abbot Elementary gymnasium Monday night, October 15th, at 7:00p.m. All warrant articles and motions will be available online at westfordma.gov by October 5th, and we will be mailing the special town meeting post cards to each home on October 3rd. There are 10 articles on the warrant, which the selectmen will be voting on at their next meeting on September 25th.

At the Selectmen's August 28th meeting, members of our Permanent Town Building Committee presented an analysis of our school administration office/building needs, as the Millennium building's useful life is possibly nearing an end over the next 4 or 5 years. The committee also updated the board on the parking analysis of the new Center Building, which concluded there is sufficient parking for the building. The board authorized the committee to proceed forward with the schematic design of the building.

The Board of Selectmen also formed a new Town and School Safety Task Force, with members to include: two Selectmen, one School Committee member, one Board of Health member, the Town Manager, Police Chief, Fire Chief, and the School Superintendent. This task force will be reviewing current safety concerns in both town and school departments including: public safety staffing levels, including the usage of school resource officers, employee hiring procedures, facility security, staff protocols, public safety response procedures, additional training requirements, wellness and mental health service availability. It is our intention to come up with a 12-month action plan to present to the board, with the possible recommendation to hire outside consultants to assist us with these issues.



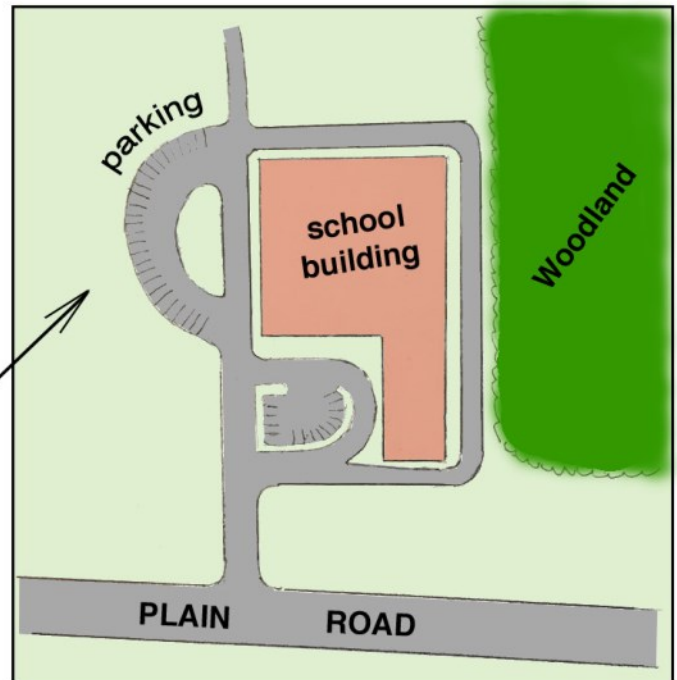

The Westford Health Department will sponsor flu clinics on the dates, times and locations listed below. No appointments are necessary. ** Please note that because of limited pediatric vaccine, we request that those under the age of 36 months receive their vaccine from their MD if possible. All children under 18 years must be accompanied by a parent at all clinics. State supply of vaccine has been greatly reduced so clinics will be held until vaccine is depleted. Please bring insurance information to the clinic as the town can seek reimbursement from insurance carriers.

This year we will be providing FLU SHOTS and Flu Mist Nasal Spray to Westford Academy and Middle School Students

and Flu Mist ONLY to the elementary schools

Limited Supply of Flu Mist Nasal Spray is available

School-based flu clinics will be offered again this year to Westford Academy, Blanchard, Stony Brook Middle School students and elementary school students this fall. Details (including dates and restrictions) will be sent to parents via the WPS Billboard listserv, WPS Superintendent's email, and the Westford Board of Health listserv. Information will not be mailed to the students' homes. **Please register your child on our Westford Health Dept website or call 978-692-5509 for further information.**

Homebound individuals, who require a home visit, should contact the Health Department at 978-692-5509 to schedule an appointment.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends a senior dose vaccine for seniors 65 years and older.

The committee recommended that the **trivalent** formulation influenza vaccines for the U.S. **2018-2019** influenza season contain the following:

- an A/Michigan/45/2015 (H1N1) pdm09-like virus
- an A/Singapore/INFIMH-16-0019/2016 (H3N2)-like virus
- a B/Colorado/06/2017-like virus (B/Victoria lineage).

The committee also recommended that **quadrivalent** influenza vaccines contain the above three strains and the following additional B strain:
a B/Phuket/3073/2013-like virus (B/Yamagata lineage)

These vaccines will not prevent illness caused by other viruses. It takes up to 2 weeks or more for protection to develop after the vaccine. Protection lasts about a year. Anyone with an allergy to egg cannot receive this vaccine at one of our public clinics.

Annual influenza vaccine is recommended for **everyone 6 months of age and older**. Everyone, regardless of prior vaccination, will need to be revaccinated to be protected this year.

People at Increased Risk for Influenza-Related Complications:

All children 6 months through 4 years of age.

All persons \geq 50 years of age.

People 6 months - 18 years of age who are receiving long-term aspirin therapy.

Women who will be pregnant during influenza season and postpartum women.

People \geq 6 months of age who have:

Chronic pulmonary (including asthma), cardiovascular (except hyper-tension), renal, hepatic, neurological, hematologic, or metabolic disorders, including diabetes;

Immunosuppression (including immunosuppression caused by medications or HIV);

Any condition (e.g., cognitive dysfunction, spinal cord injuries, seizure disorders, or other neuromuscular disorders) that can compromise respiratory function or the handling of respiratory secretions or that can increase the risk of aspiration.

Residents of nursing homes and other chronic-care facilities.

American Indians/Alaska Natives

People who are morbidly obese (BMI \geq 40)

PLASTIC BAGS, empty or filled, are NOT acceptable in recycling bins and toters. Any and all recycling with plastic bags is discarded as trash. Contamination is costly to the town and the hauler.

NOT ACCEPTED: Styrofoam food containers, including cups and trays, and packing peanuts.

BRUSH CHIPPING

Saturday, October 13, 2018, 10:30 am – 4:30 pm

Westford Highway Garage, 28 North Street

Proof of Westford residency required.

ACCEPTED: Brush and branches up to 3 inches in diameter and 10 feet in length.

Must be average residential brush categories and reasonable amounts: A load ranges from a trunk to pickup truck -----volume, includes a tow behind a full trailer.

NOT ACCEPTED: Building materials (e.g. fences, boards), land clearing materials and debris (e.g., roots, bushes, anything mixed with poison ivy), grass, and leaves.

Cost: \$10 per load, checks preferred, payable to the Town of Westford.

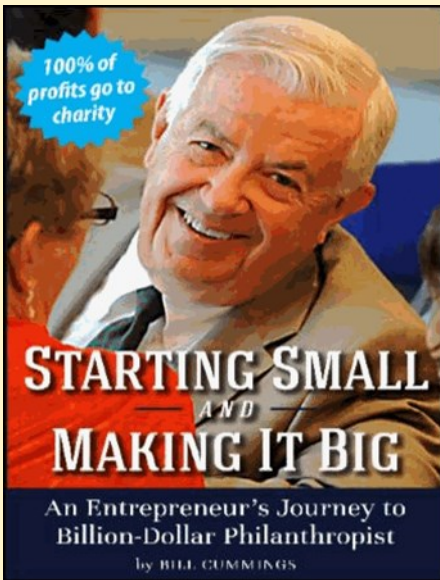
