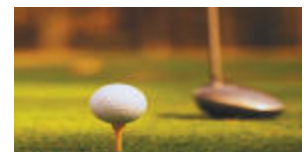
FATHER'S DAY TAILGATE EXTRAVAGANA WITH MUSICAL ENTERTAINER ROGER TINCKNELL

A Message to the Social Security Beneficiaries and Supplemental Security Income Recipients:

There is a document that provides information for Social Security beneficiaries (retirement, survivors, disability) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients related to economic impact payments being issued to eligible individuals. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS), not the Social Security Administration (SSA), will send all payments electronically or paper checks by mail. We documented for you different scenarios to help explain what actions, if any, you may need to take to receive your economic impact payment and any payment for a qualifying child. **However, only the IRS can answer questions you may have about your personal or family situation. Please do not call SSA with your payment questions.** Visit www.irs.gov/coronavirus for the latest information available. You can find the information you need by following these steps:

Go to <https://www.ssa.gov/coronavirus/>

Read: How do I get my economic impact payment

Locate the blue text that describes which monthly benefit you receive and when you started receiving benefits

Look for the row that matches your situation whether you filed a 2019 or 2018 tax return, and whether you have any qualifying children.

If you have concerns about getting food, please read this....

- If you have funds, but are concerned about going to the store, call Alison at 978-399-2325 to request a volunteer shopper.
- If you don't have enough money, visit the Westford Food Pantry outside the senior center on Wed evening 6-8 or Friday morning 9-11. They are providing pre-packed bags outside and respecting social distancing requirements. If you are concerned about leaving your house, call Alison about having a food pantry bag delivered.
- If you don't have enough money for food, you can also apply for SNAP. The easiest way to do this is to use the screening tool on the Mass.gov/DTA/COVID-19. If you need help, Alison can assist you over the phone by entering your information on the website. You can also call the Project Bread Food Source Hotline at 1-800-645-8333.
- Meals on Wheels has been expanded to seniors who are homebound because of Covid-19. If you are interested in home delivered meals through Elder Services of Merrimack Valley, call 1-800-892-0890 to request.

The Cameron is offering **SHINE** (Serving The Health Insurance Needs of Everyone*) appointments on **Monday, June 8** with Fred Baumert, SHINE Counselor and Westford resident. SHINE Counselors provide unbiased health insurance information one on one with individuals in their own communities, giving guidance on health care programs including Medicare, Medigap, Medicare Advantage Plans, Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage and more. **To make a phone consultation appointment call the COA at 978-692-5523.** SHINE is administered by the MA. Executive Office of Elder Affairs under a grant from The Administration of Community Living.

**BEWARE COVID-19 THEMED SCAMS:
District Attorney Marian Ryan shared this information....**

Especially during this time, we remind you to beware of individuals using fraudulent information to target vulnerable populations, particularly our seniors. Scammers and hackers may exploit concerns regarding COVID-19 in order to obtain personal information or demand money.

Common scams:

- Fraudulent texts, emails, social media posts with links for coronavirus information that install malware software on a device to steal personal information, including passwords and credit card numbers
- Fraudulent websites related to the virus outbreak, including fake online stores selling protective wear and household supplies
- Fraudulent calls, emails, websites seeking charitable donations
- Communications promoting fraudulent treatment information
- Calls demanding money for treatment for family members with the virus
- Fraudulent communications offering investment advice or information on the economic impact of COVID-19
- Individuals posing as family member or friend and seeking money for an urgent matter

Helpful tips:

- Beware of any calls, emails or other communications with “urgent” demands for money or seeking to verify personal information
- Carefully review any emails or correspondence from organizations seeking charitable donations
- Make charitable donations directly on the organization’s website
- Beware of solicitations for money over the phone
- Never send money to a person you do not recognize or cannot verify their identity
- Beware of fraudulent emails that appear to be from reputable sources
- Check URL link (official government publications end in .gov), email addresses and spelling errors
- Do not download attachments or click on links in unsolicited emails or from unknown senders

Hanover Westford Hills is a 180-unit rental apartment community located at 1 Westford Hills Road, Westford. 36 Units will be made available through this application process. Of these units, there is a mix of 1BR, 2BR, and 3BR apartments, and one 3BR townhome available. WestfordHills is a distinctive apartment community. The project will include residential amenities such as a professionally landscaped courtyard, resort style pool, and BBQs for outdoor grilling. The project will also include a clubhouse with a demonstration kitchen, fitness center, cinema, conference room, e-lounge, and televisions. Unit finishes will be the highest end in the marketplace. Kitchens will contain a breakfast bar, frameless cabinets, stainless appliances, stone countertops, tile backsplashes, and wood-style flooring. Living areas will feature 9' ceilings, wood-style flooring, and track lighting. Bedrooms will have carpet flooring, and bathrooms will include frameless cabinets, framed mirrors, garden tubs with tile surround, natural stone countertops, and porcelain tile flooring. Future built conditions may vary.

If you would like to vote early, by mail, for the June 30, 2020 Annual Town Election, you may request to do so by filling out the application. After you fill it out, return it either by mail (Town Clerk's Office, 55 Main St, Westford MA 01886), fax (978-399-2555) or email (townclerk@westfordma.gov). Ballots will be mailed when they become available. Once you have voted, you can mail the ballot back to us **by Friday, June 26** at 55 Main St, Westford, MA 01886. Gaining Grounds starting in June! ORGANIC VEGETABLE DISTRIBUTION



Every Thursday, starting June 4, 1:30 pm

We are excited to resume our relationship with Gaining Grounds of Concord once again offering their organic produce weekly to all Westford residents that meet income guidelines. (Fuel assistance income criteria). To participate, one must sign an income attestation on the day of produce pick up. Please bring your own pen for health/safety purposes. This distribution will be held at the Westford Housing Authority at 65 Tadmuck Rd in the Community Center parking lot. Due to pandemic restrictions, the produce will be pre-bagged and handed out at 6-foot markers. People will be encouraged to wait in their cars or apartments and not in groups nor in the community center hallway. Because this program is so desirable, people often arrive early. Therefore, we will pass out disposable numbers starting at 1:00 in the order that people arrive. The freshly picked and packaged vegetables will be distributed at 1:30. Please plan to pick up a bag for only **your own household**. If you have an extenuating circumstance and want to discuss alternate arrangements to get your bag, please call Chuck Dutton by the Monday prior to distribution. **Any questions call Chuck at 978-399-2322.**

HAVE HOME REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE NEEDS? – SIGN UP FOR HELP BY Friday June 12

U.M. ARMY (United Methodist Action Reach-out Mission by Youth) is a mission group of youth, young adults and their adult mentors. U.M. ARMY works with social service, community and church organizations to identify people in need of assistance. The U.M. ARMY volunteers will be working together the last week of July to complete home repair and maintenance jobs for those unable to pay or to physically do the work themselves. Jobs are selected and completed based on greatest need. Examples of the work that can be done include, home repairs (i.e. installing railings, fixing steps, removing wood rot), painting, and yard work. You will be required to sign a release that volunteers can be on your property. If you have a project that you would like assessed, please contact Alison by June 12th at 978-399-2325.

CRITICAL HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

This is a program coordinated by Habitat for Humanity to help low income homeowners to maintain their homes. Repairs can include roof replacement, structural walls, handicap accessibility renovations, exterior finishes, repairs to satisfy town building codes etc. The homeowner is responsible to pay only 25% of the project value. MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOANER PROGRAM

We have equipment to borrow if you are in need. We can leave it for you outside our back door for pick up or it can be delivered to your home. Please only donate clean and functional equipment in excellent condition. We **CAN NOT** accept the following: crutches, knee/back braces, oxygen tanks and tubing, foam padding, dietary supplement drinks, and personal hygiene products. KEYSAFE LOCK BOXES

This program with the Fire Dept. has been a huge success with over 40 lock boxes installed at senior's homes. If you live alone, have medical issues or frequently need to call 911 then you are a candidate for a key safe lock box. The heavy-duty metal box is installed on the outside of your home and it has a keypad with a code to access a key inside the box. The fire dept, your neighbors and family can have the code to prevent damaging your home to enter in an emergency. For more information or to sign up for the program call Jennifer at 978-399-2323.



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Pre-Planned
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Beware of fraudulent offers for COVID-19 testing from door-to-door, grocery store, telephone and mail order offerings- It is probably a scam!

The Massachusetts Senior Medicare Patrol (MA SMP) Program is warning the public to be wary of anyone other than a treating physician who is offering you coronavirus testing. Be particularly suspicious of anyone offering COVID-19 testing in exchange for your Medicare number, money, or to gain access into your home. Testing can only be ordered by a treating physician. We have heard about teams in white coats going door-to-door offering virus testing.

Never accept a coronavirus test from someone:

- Who comes to your door;
- Who approaches you at the grocery store or other community venue, parking lot, etc.;
- Who calls offering a mail-in test in exchange for money or Medicare number;
- Who calls to request your bank card or account information to pay for a test.
- Always call the Westford Police Department at 978-399-2345 if you experience this type of community encounter

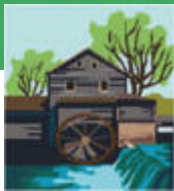

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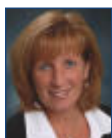
